The Public Sector is moving to ever more digitisation and e-services to reduce costs under even tighter budgetary constraints. Amid growing concerns of increased energy consumption and the sustainability of IT and data centre facilities, over the past few years, many EU governments have started to push for more consolidation of public sector ICT services under various Cloud initiatives. In December 2015, the Irish Government published an <u>Advice Note: Considering</u> <u>Cloud Services</u> in support of the Public Service ICT strategy.
